Her pedagogy originates from the intersection of stage management theory with stage management practice, and she is committed to teaching how theory can influence a stage manager's approach. Narda has worked internationally, regionally, & on Broadway. She closely collaborated with August Wilson, originating four of his Century Cycle plays & two revivals. With Lisa Porter, Narda is co-author of Stage Management Theory as a Guide to Practice: Cultivating a Creative Approach.*


